PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Greetings from the Alumni Association Board of Directors!

We are proud to bring you the 2017 edition of the ROAR. Please read it cover-to-cover to find out about happenings in your Alumni Association. You may notice some minor changes in the format of the ROAR this year. Over the next few years we will be making changes in order to reduce the cost. The printing and mailing of the ROAR is funded by member dues and administrative fund contributions. These revenue sources have remained fairly flat as operating costs have increased. You will notice in the 2016 financial report that we operated with a deficit for the second year in a row. In order to keep the ROAR coming to you, we encourage you to pay your dues and/or target a portion of your annual contribution to the administrative fund.

The scholarship fund, however, is very healthy with a market value at the end of 2016 of \$758,000, an increase of about \$64,000 over last year. This will allow us to award scholarships in the amount of \$32,000 this spring. Our graduates sincerely appreciate the support of our Alumni Association in providing these scholarship opportunities.

This year's annual meeting and dinner will be held on June 23, 2017. The venue has been

They both served our Association with distinction for many years and have retired from the Board recently. Please join us in extending our sincere thanks to them for their dedicated service. They join Foster Berkheimer, Class of 1946, current emeritus Board member.

HALL OF FAME
GUIDELINES

The Mechanicsburg Area High School Alumni Association recognizes, by nomination to the "Hall of Fame," select Mechanicsburg High School graduates who have met the Hall of Fame guidelines.

Hall of Fame categories are: Service to Humanity, Loyalty to Mechanicsburg High School, Outstanding Achievement in Athletics, and Outstanding Achievement in a Chosen Profession.

- Selections limited to four per year, no more than two in any one category
- Once a person is inducted into the Hall of Fame, he/she will not be considered for a future inclusion in another category
- Nominee for Outstanding Achievement in Athletics must have graduated at least ten years prior to selection, and a nominee's consideration is based on high school and post-high school achievements in athletics. (Exceptions to the latter guideline is up to the discretion of the Hall of Fame Committee).
- Nominee for Outstanding Loyalty to Mechanicsburg High School must have graduated at least fifteen years prior to selection
- Nominee for Outstanding Achievement in a Chosen Profession or for Service to Humanity must have graduated twenty years prior to selection
- Individual may not nominate himself
- Candidates not selected in the year of nomination will be reconsidered for a maximum of five successive years
- Nominations must be submitted by 12/31 prior to the Annual Alumni Dinner meeting

To nominate a person, please submit the following:

- A narrative letter of recommendation to include category and reasons for the nomination.
- A current high resolution color photo of the nominee
- Any important biographical information supporting the nominee.
- Name, address, phone number and email address of both the person nominating and the nominee.



A. Thomas McLellan
Class of 1966

*Outstanding Achievement
in a Chosen Profession*

A. Thomas McLellan (or Mac as he was known at MHS) graduated from Mechanicsburg Area Senior High School in 1966 and then from Colgate University in 1970 where he earned a Bachelor of Arts degree. He also attended a visiting fellowship at Oxford University in England in 1971. Following a tour of duty in the United States Army 1972 - 1973, he went on to specialize in the field of psychology earning a Ph.D. from Bryn Mawr College in 1976. From there went on to have an outstanding career as a professor, a world class career researcher, author, public speaker and ultimately an advisor to the President of the United States.

All of Tom McLellan's professional career has been devoted to the study of alcohol and drug addiction. That career started and developed at the Coatesville and Philadelphia Veterans Administration Medical Centers – a 30 year period of service. While there he concurrently held academic positions in the psychiatry departments of Thomas Jefferson Medical College and particularly the University of Pennsylvania School of Medicine where he is now an emeritus Professor of Psychiatry.

Dr. McLellan's addiction research began with the development of two important measures known as the "addiction severity index, (ASI)" and the "treatment services review (TSR)," both of which are internationally used (over 30 countries) to characterize the type and duration of problems presented by addicted patients. That research has led to over 450 published research articles and chapters on addiction; as well as accolades from many professional societies such as Lifetime Achievement Awards from the American, British, Chinese, Italian and French medical societies. His work was featured by newspapers like the New York Times, USA Today, Wall Street Journal, and The Washington Post; and he has appeared on TV programs such as 60 minutes, Good Morning America, CNN Situation Room, CBS World New Round-Up and over 30 National Public Radio programs.

An important change in Tom's career began in 1992 when he found that his own son became addicted. He realized that his academic research had not prepared him for the intense family problems faced by addicted individuals and their families. He founded the Treatment Research Institute, a not-for-profit organization devoted to translating clinical and basic research into practical tools and support services that could be used by families; and into evidence-based policies that could be implemented by cities, states and countries to address addiction.

The practicality and policy relevance of his work caught the attention of then newly elected President Obama; and he asked Tom to become the Deputy Director of the Office of National Drug Control Policy. For the next two years Dr. McLellan was charged with the responsibility of advising the President and coordinating all federal drug interdiction, prevention and treatment efforts by writing the National Drug Control Strategy which remains in effect today.

Since leaving federal service in 2012 Tom returned to the University of Pennsylvania and the Treatment Research Institute, but retired from both in 2015 to Sarasota Florida where he lives with his wife Kerry. He remains active in the field however and recently served as the Senior Scientific Editor for the 2017 Surgeon General's Report on Facing Addiction.

Throughout his career, Mac worked tirelessly to learn and apply scientific knowledge into practical tools and policies to help those who suffer from alcohol and drug addiction; their families and their communities. In short, he helped create a better more helpful world.



Dr. James W. Skillen
Class of 1962

*Outstanding Achievement in
a Chosen Profession*

Jim graduated from Mechanicsburg High School in 1962, then went on to receive a B.A. from Wheaton College in philosophy. Three years later he received a Bachelor of Divinity degree from Westminster Theological Seminary. He then studied philosophy for a year at the Free University of Amsterdam before entering Duke University for graduate study. In 1974, Jim completed his Ph.D. in political science at Duke.

From 1973 to 1982, Jim taught political theory and international relations at three Christian colleges, one of which is local, Messiah College. He is well-known and highly regarded as a noted Christian political philosopher and author. In 1977, he helped found a public policy think tank in Washington D.C., called the Center for Public Justice (CPJ). He became the executive director and then president of this organization from 1981 to 2009. The CPJ is an independent, nonpartisan and non-profit organization devoted to policy research and civic education. The CPJ was sustained in large part through gifts and grants to work on topics such as education and welfare reform, agriculture and environmental policy, foreign and defense policy. His studies of others' views and political movements played a key role in shaping his outlook and questions about public life from a Christian point of view. One of his first books (1990) was *The Scattered Voice: Christians at Odds in the Public Square*.

Jim traveled extensively giving lectures, mentoring, and participating on political and academic panels at home and abroad. He has been to Canada, Mexico, Europe, Russia, Australia and China to name a few places his work has taken him. His books focus primarily on areas of political philosophy and practice, including international relations, as well as biblical studies.

Dr. Skillen received the Abraham Kuyper Prize for Excellence in Reformed Theology and Public Life from Princeton Theological Seminary in 2001. In 2016 he received an honorary Doctor of Divinity degree from Westminster Theological Seminary. He is a member of Phi Beta Kappa. In retirement, he continues to write, do research, and travel in the U.S. and abroad to give lectures. His most recent book (2014) is entitled *The Good of Politics: A Biblical, Historical, and Contemporary Introduction*.

Jim is married to his high school sweetheart, Doreen Wittlinger Skillen (Mechanicsburg class of 1963) and they now live in Birmingham, Alabama near their daughter and family. Their son and family live in Grand Rapids, Michigan. They have four grandsons. Jim enjoys music, reading, walking and golfing when time permits.

THE ONE ROOM SCHOOL HOUSES OF UPPER ALLEN

If you attended a one-room school house in Mechanicsburg Area and you are willing to be interviewed by phone or in person for a larger project, please contact the Mechanicsburg Area School District Archives at 717.691.4500 x 4094 and ask for the Archivist.

The Mechanicsburg School District Archives is located on the second floor of the Elmwood Building. The collection is available to professional historians, students of history, and those individuals interested in the legacy of the school district and the role that public education has played in the community. Anyone wishing to conduct research should call 717.691.4500 to make an appointment.

In 1834, with the passage of the Free School Act in Pennsylvania, each legal municipality was given the task of designing a system that would best educate the children of their jurisdiction. Larger entities such as the School District of Mechanicsburg and later the School District of Shiremanstown constructed multiple room buildings and divided their students into primary and grammar schools and later into grades. Students walked to a central location for school.

Because of the size of Upper Allen, the multi-room school was not an option. Instead, the Upper Allen School District was divided into nine geographic districts each holding a one-room school. By law, each building had to be no more than three miles apart so a student did not have to walk more than one-and-a-half miles both in the morning and again in the afternoon. Schools did not close for bad weather and students were expected to trudge to school no matter how deep the snow, although a student who missed in those conditions would be excused.

The teacher began the day with the pledge to the flag and a short Bible reading. The students in each class, often starting with grade one, were called to the front of the room to review past lessons, receive new material, and an assignment due the next class period. After the teacher finished with grade one, grade two came to the front, followed by all eight grades in succession. While at their desks the students were expected to work on the assignment of the day. If the teacher started with English then mathematics was the next subject taught in this manner with time in the schedule for other subjects including science, history, geography, art, and music.

The interior of the one-room school house often had a black board in the front along with a teacher's desk. The desk was often on a raised platform. It was on the platform that the students received their lessons. Most of the rooms consisted of student desks, hooks for coats, and a coal burning stove. While the schools of Upper Allen did have electric lights they did not have indoor plumbing or water. Water was fetched from a neighbor's pump, and the out houses were normally located in the back of the building.

There was time in the schedule for recess and a longer break at lunch. Students were expected to pack a brown bag lunch, and they often ate at their desk, the front porch, or other favorite place in the area of the school. If the weather allowed, students were permitted to go outside and play ball, tag or other games that would help release energy. The Bowmansdale School had a toboggan that students could use if there was snow on the ground.

The Upper Allen school district closed their one-room school houses, on February 2, 1953, when they opened the consolidated school of Upper Allen, today the Shepherdstown Elementary School. Many of the teachers in the consolidated building had been teachers in the one-room school houses of the district. Some of the one room school houses such as Shepherdstown and Mount Allen are no longer standing. Other buildings are still standing and used as residences, such as the Allendale, Glen Allen, Center Square, and Garrett Grove Schools.

Retaining their original appearance while taking on a new role are the Graham's School, currently an insurance agency, and the Bowmansdale School, currently an Odd Fellow's Lodge. The Kollertown School is currently part of the Little Theater of Mechanicsburg.

We achieve our mission only through the dedicated support and financial contributions from individuals and businesses that choose to invest in the Foundation with their time, talent and treasure.

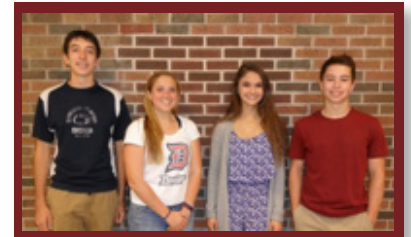
2016 Changes to the Foundation

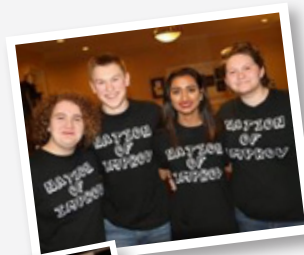

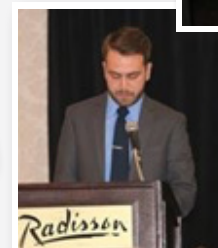

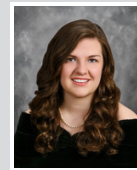
